PGC Basketball

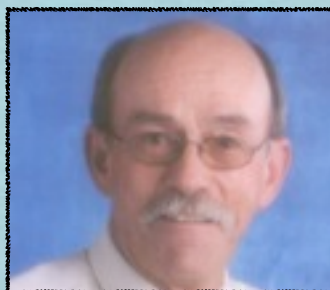

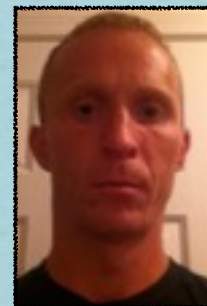

Article II – Purpose

Section 1. The purpose of the organization shall be:

- b) To encourage and recognize professional accomplishments through the sponsorship of achievement programs and awards. Awards in the form of certificates and plaques shall be symbolic in nature. FROM THE PRESIDENT

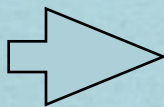
